City of Lexington Proclamation

DECLARING END OF STATE OF EMERGENCY AS A RESULT OF HURRICANE FLORENCE

WHEREAS, the onset and aftermath effects of Hurricane Florence resulted in heavy rainfall, high winds, flooding, downed trees and power lines, impacting roadways, public and private property, and essential utility services and systems within the City of Lexington and throughout the County of Davidson; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor of the City of Lexington is authorized and empowered by the City of Lexington, North Carolina, Code of Ordinances, under Chapter 4, Emergency Management, Sec. 4.2, and the North Carolina General Statutes 166A-19.3 et. seq. and 166A-19.22 to issue a public proclamation declaring to all persons the existence of a State of Emergency; and


WHEREAS, on September 14, 2018, Lexington Mayor determined and proclaimed a local State of Emergency for the City of Lexington; and

WHEREAS, on September 21, 2018, Lexington Mayor determined current and future threats resulting from Hurricane Florence were no longer critical as of 12:00 midnight in the City of Lexington and thereby terminated the proclamation of a local State of Emergency;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT PROCLAIMED that a State of Emergency for the City of Lexington, County of Davidson, North Carolina, declared on September 14, 2018, is hereby ended and no longer exists effective this day, September 21, 2018, at 12:00 midnight.
